

I export Facebook group members lists from the members tab of the group. I simply save the html file, and extract the details from the html file. I then analyze the data to get cumulative members for different time increments. In the files in this folder, the “stat” column is the cumulative members as of the date in question. You can make scatter plots by using the “statId” and “stat” columns.

I have included the users list, as of 3/5/2021, for one public group “Asperger’s Syndrome Awareness and Support Group”. You can verify that my members list is accurate, using that spreadsheet. Search the member’s list on Facebook and look at their join dates. You will see that my spreadsheet is accurate (note that some join dates had to be approximated, as Facebook didn’t give the exact date). * Asperger’s Syndrome Awareness and Support Group is no longer public. I have now included a members list for the public Facebook group called “Psychology Group”. It is a partial members list, with ~ 9,400 members. Note that in the members lists, the “joinDate” column is calculated based on universal time. Some join dates may be slightly inaccurate. To fix this, add a separate column that adjusts for your time zone.

I also have a pdf titled joinRates.pdf that has graphs I made in a software called JASP. On the joinDates.pdf file, the y-axis represents cumulative members; the x-axis represents months. It is a graph of cumulative members as of each month listed. The months are represented numerically.

I have also added daily members graphs for several groups. You can see how the join rate in these groups increases after I become a member. The group Autism Society of North Carolina is a control. There are no scammers in that group.

Wells Fargo has inundated these groups with thousands and thousands of members. They do this for legal reasons, which are explained in some of the videos.

Also note that some members lists are used as controls. The groups where this scam is happening are High Functioning Autism, Autism Family & Support (f/k/a High Functioning Autism Awareness and Support), and Asperger's Syndrome Awareness and Support Group. There are other groups where this is happening but which I have no posts collected for analysis.
