

6/24/2019 Appointment

On the **6/24/2019** appointment, I tell Kathy how I don't read like I used to. I tell her that I think I can concentrate well. Near the end of the appointment, I once again bring up the suspect behavior from the finance department. I tell her how Shirley was asking for my full social security number. I tell Kathy how Shirley at the finance department claims that I left Jenny's work number on my intake paperwork. I tell her that I do not recall doing any intake paperwork when I was admitted to the inpatient unit in April 2019. I tell Kathy how I don't recall seeing an alternate contact number in Atrium's systems.

Key Takeaways From the 6/13/2019 and 6/24/2019 Appointments

- As of 5/31/2019, we have evidence, already, that my hospital is involved in crime (HIPAA violations – how does my sister know my doctor's number, etc.).
- Even before that, I am a liability for my hospital, and Kathy most likely became aware of this by the first week of May.
- I have told Kathy how this officer's actions are illegal. I tell her that I looked it up, and he is facing 3 years prison time. My argument for the wrongdoing is a legal argument, based on the fact that the officer didn't have the petition in his possession when he came to my apartment. None of this makes it to my records. I am not described as "paranoid", "manic", etc. for having this belief.
- I have told her more suspect details about Mobile Crisis. I tell her how this counselor is Jenny's personal friend. I tell her about one counselor repeatedly asking "do you have a mental illness?"
- Kathy gives the very strong appearance that she has figured out the behavior from the finance department is suspect and likely criminal.

Cumulative Takeaways as of the 6/13/2019 and 6/24/2019 Appointments

- In **2018** (roughly **January** through **May**), I had to adjust my medication. My Zyprexa (Olanzapine) had been causing me increasingly severe cognitive impairment. I had described it as “dementia like symptoms”
- I called Atrium on **4/16/2019** and **4/17/2019**, to tell them that Jenny was up to no good. I tell her how Jenny is running scams and may try to get my medical records.
- On **4/21/2019**, I am brought to Atrium’s inpatient unit, over a civil commitment petition that was filed by Jenny. The petition has the time taken into custody and the time delivered to the examination unit entered as the exact same times (11:43 pm). It would seem likely that as of **5/1/2019**, Kathy and (possibly) others at Atrium know this. Morci may have seen it before she examined me in the early morning hours of **4/22/2019**. Since I have told Kathy about the suspect details in these appointments, it would seem reasonable that Kathy would have looked it up.
- On **4/23/2019**, in an examination process that Kathy was a part of, multiple professionals at Atrium come to the conclusion that there is absolutely nothing wrong with me. On that day, they schedule me to be discharged on **4/24/2019**. I am told, before leaving that “it’s a good thing that you’ve been here, because you’ve been examined and we found nothing.”
- During my inpatient stay, I ask for Jenny’s number and my mother’s number to be deleted. This is after I consent to a request which I perceive to be to talk to my mother and Jenny one single time. I am refused this request twice, by the same social worker.
- I have told Kathy, on the **4/25/2019** and **5/1/2019** appointments, the suspect nature of what had occurred. I told her about the officer not having the petition in his possession. I told her about the girl refusing to delete the numbers.
- I showed Kathy one piece of evidence for Jenny’s privacy violation (the text), and Kathy agreed that it was suspect. Here I have provided at least one piece of evidence that substantiates my claims.
- As of **5/31/2019**, I am already a liability for my hospital, and it is likely that Kathy has figured this out. Kathy’s attitude seems to reflect this.
- As of **6/24/2019**, I have given clear evidence of very serious crimes

- As of the same, I have also told her about a slew of very suspect details concerning the involuntary commitment process that occurred on **4/21/2019**. This includes the crisis counselor's strange behavior. It includes the fact that the crisis counselor is Jenny's personal friend. It includes that the officer wasn't in possession of the petition when he came to my residence. It includes that the officer was also Jenny's personal friend.
