As of about the past week, I have a new impairment. I get up and take my adderall, and it takes me 2 and a half hours before I have the energy to do anything. This is from my body being weakened, I think. It is also probably from my overly sedentary lifestyle. That is making it worse, I am sure.

This apartment we live in is tiny and I don't have room to do anything. My bowflex free weights are at my building in TN and so is my bench. They are probably gone now. That building is getting robbed over and over, the same as the abandoned old house above it has been for years. 98% of my books are in there, and so this is like everything that I worked my whole life for is being taken away from me. I loved those weights and I loved my books.

I can't afford a storage building for them. It's expensive and I don't make much with disability. I also have cut my losses, mentally, as much as it hurts. If I can get something out of this fight, I can buy all my books back and my weights too. That's too much to ask however. When someone pays the price for Wells Fargo's conduct, it is paid in full.

I am extremely tormented right now. I am tormented so much of the time. I'm very worried that social security is going to take my disability away. I haven't been diligent in conveying to my doctor how impaired that I am. I can't exactly help it. I am unable to manage my life.

My aunt, that paid for Wells Fargo's brain scan, I talked to her the other day, for the first time in a long time. She takes care of 3 adopted great grandchildren and is retired. She told me, on this most recent call, how much she gets from social security retirement. It is \$397 a month. I hope Wells Fargo enjoys that brain scan that she paid for.
