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I'm calling you bigots in public

I just made a series of tweets on Twitter, where I call Wells Fargo and the Justice Department bigots and, to paraphrase, "prejudiced assholes." This may seem like an odd behavior, or at least one that isn't on the same page with some of my emails to you. On the one hand, I send you emails about how bad I suffer and how bad I need help. On the other, I call you names and criticize you in public. The latter behavior may seem to be not conducive to getting the help that I beg for in the former behavior. It would seem that, maybe, if I wanted your help, I should tell you what great people that you are.

Let me explain. For one, I have no idea how to tell you what great people that you are. That would make things very confusing. I don't know what to say after that. It's much easier for me to be honest and speak the facts of the situation. I tell you that I need help, because I need help. I tell you that I suffer incredibly, because I suffer incredibly. I call you bigots and prejudiced assholes, because you are bigots and prejudiced assholes, or at the very least you behave like both of those.

You are bigots for many reasons, the comment elements to all of them being 1. my harmless mental health issues, which are part of a harmless condition of being that I did not and could not choose. And 2. your attitude towards me based on the aforementioned. You justify committing vicious crimes against me because of my history of treatment for mental health and my harmless condition of being. You further put it in my face, what contempt you have for the mentally ill, by using a despicable tactic where you cover up your crimes by using my mental illness against me, and by how you allow funds intended for the mentally ill and other vulnerable people to pay for your crimes. This bank has such vast resources, and you are so committed to the outcome that it is not to pay for the consequences of its actions, that you allow this vulgarity to ensue. Note that when I say "you", I am sometimes referring to the justice department, sometimes referring to Wells Fargo, and sometimes referring to both collectively. You can infer from the context which of these that it is.

This last behavior I describe, where something like \$20,000 of money intended for the poor, the vulnerable, and the mentally ill is used to cover-up Wells Fargo's crimes, to the knowledge of and with the approval of the Justice Department, makes it clear who the Justice Department thinks is important and who it does not. The justice department would appear to hold the people at Wells Fargo to be infinitely important, and to hold the rights and wellbeing of the poor, the vulnerable, and the mentally ill to be a side note that warrants exactly 0 consideration.

I've got additional reasons to call you assholes and could elaborate a lot more on the charge of bigoted, but it is my bedtime and I'm very tired.

I have no idea what fruitiness is ensuing at the justice department. Wells Fargo is digging in its heels with equal or greater force than when it started, and is being as despicable and as cruel as ever. It's possible, but not likely, that the offensive behavior of the justice department is driven by some benign variety of fruitiness, or even that you feel bad about what you've done.

Read the above. This is what your behavior says about you. I wish so bad that I had something better to say about you.

The odds that this gets put in the media in the next 1 to 3 months are now better than 50/50. I'm not sure how much better, and I don't think it's much, but this is progress. Maybe 55/45 would be close. I won't stop until it is at 100 percent. You're going to be found out. You will have to answer for your rotten conduct and it's possible that I will have to answer for something like the entirety of my life. If that's the case, I say bring it on. My life is very defensible, and your rotten conduct is extremely not so. You have been so cruel to me, when I didn't do anything to you.
