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## **This situation**

I'm sorry for all of the disparaging things that I have said about the justice department. What you have done to me is extremely wrong and immoral. I am a very badly damaged person. My life will consist of terrible suffering for a large portion of the rest of my life. I am suffering very badly right now. I very often want to die, to escape my ongoing suffering and feeling of being a demolished human being.

I have more to say about this and will send you more later. I knew from the beginning that something with the economy might get in the way with me getting justice. What I expected was that the Justice Department would work out something and do the best it could. I didn't understand how this banks conduct and the economy are connected, and I thought that it might be possible to prosecute the individuals involved. If not all of them, I thought maybe you could prosecute some of the smaller players and compel the bank to give me some money. I had all kinds of thoughts about what you might be able to do and what you might do.

In the early times in my fight, like January 2020 to maybe May 2020, I consistently thought in terms that were sort of grand. I thought that the Justice Department would be extremely mad at Wells Fargo for committing crimes under the justice department's nose, and I thought that the justice department would be appalled by this sickening and despicable abuse of a kindhearted man. I thought it possible that the justice department organizes a raid on the CIC building in Charlotte. People would go to jail. I would attract the interest of civil attorneys or I would file a lawsuit on my own. I would go into court screaming and crying like I did at my bankruptcy case, and me and/or my civil attorneys would get a huge judgment. As a proxy, without doing any itemized calculations, I used a figure of \$85 billion dollars. I would get this judgment and then go overseas to be put to death.

Then starting sometime around June 2020, I started hedging my bets. I thought of how it's human nature to be overly optimistic and that things never turn out as nice and tidy as we want. I went back and forth, from possibilities of Wells Fargo getting raided, to the authorities doing absolutely nothing, to the authorities coming to prosecute me and at the same time my healthcare records being published on the internet. Part of this thought process came from me thinking about people I'd saw on different documentaries, who had terrible things happen to them and were then treated like garbage by the authorities. These people all suffered terrible injustices. I considered the possibility that I am dealt another routine injustice of the type that these people had experienced.

Overall, still, I thought that something good would probably happen. I thought that the justice department would have an attitude of "we can't have this" in reference to these terrible crimes against me. I pictured this attitude as leading to some kind of outcome for me, even if there were constraints on what the justice department could do because of the economy.

I will write more later. I'll just state for now that I never, ever thought of a cover-up happening. If someone had the ability to monitor my never thoughts and did a tally, I probably thought of at least 1,000 different outcomes for what might happen. This is in part because I never stop thinking. Not a single one of these 1,000+ outcomes involved a coverup by the Justice Department.
