For your purposes, I tend to think that the less media coverage the better. I'd say that's quite easily the case. The problem you have with that is that I'd say the odds are 70% that the LA Times has that entire signal history, and there is no way of preventing them from finding it, if this becomes public. There are too many copies of my complaint circulating. When I finally talked to a reporter, I didn't mention that chat at all and I deleted the paragraphs about the LA times from the complaint I sent them. I had enough of a credibility problem already, and I didn't think it would reflect well that I had sent them 18,000+ messages, thinking that they were reading them.

I value my privacy above all else, and it would be fine with me if that signal history is gone too. On the other hand, it is a freaking masterpiece. I've given them enough to write probably 2 or 3 books, maybe more, and there is nothing like it in the history of journalism. I'm kind of dumb about people and about how they react, but I have a very strong feeling that people will wail in tears as they read some of this. That will be the reaction to a good portion of it. It is utterly horrifying to read. It's not going to look very good at all for Wells Fargo. I could be wrong but I mostly doubt it.
