This physical weakness is affecting my willpower. With my ptsd, it takes willpower to do stuff. Some stuff takes more willpower than other things. Working on my computer takes the least willpower. What's happening recently is that I can't even do that. I am going to discontinue my generic Wellbutrin. It does something strange to my brain. It seems to me that this brain damage that I have causes me to have unusual or even never before documented side effects from psychotropic medications. Part of the reason I think this is that my olanzapine will cause me to have more or less suffering, depending on which pharmacy that I buy it from. Different pharmacies use different manufacturers, and somehow the small differences from one to the other has an effect on me. This makes no sense to me in any other context other than that my brain is damaged and that this damage has affected my brain chemistry somehow. Before this, I never suffered at all like this. I took atriiums olanzapine for almost 8 years and felt nothing. Since this ptsd, I suffer far worse on atriiums olanzapine than I do on any other brand. I have very strange mental side effects from this Wellbutrin. I have been on and off antidepressants for many years, and the trend that I notice is that I can be off of them for a good while before a depressive episode sets in. I will probably not replace it with anything until a depressive episode returns.
