If I get able, I might make some audios to send to the federal reserve. If I do, it is possible that I also send them to you. This bank did this. This nightmare situation we are in is their responsibility. People are only human and everyone makes mistakes, but this is the fact of the matter.

I told my new psychologist a little bit about the man Chris that I told you about. He's the one that I have suspected you have talked to. I'm on the fence about that now, and have been for a while. I saw it as a near certainty in late December and early 2021. If you have spoken to him, everything is exactly as I say it is. If you have an idea about him and the situation with him, what you do is your compare your version with mine. The places where your version matches mine are exactly correct, and the places where your version differs from mine are wrong. How wrong they are can be judged by how far off from my version that they are.
