This matches what I have described to you exactly. Part of the reason is that this AI returns your answers in a similar format to how the questions are asked, but in the end that amounts to nothing. You will have trouble getting it to state things are opposite of my explanations. I'd say the only way to do that is to frame questions incorrectly in a very blatant way.

In the answer that references "sick", "evil", or "damaged", note that I didn't ask it about damaged. It gave that on its own. I have described the effects of my abuse to you in similar terms. I used "flawed." I've got plenty more answers where ChatGPT spontaneously says stuff that mirrors exactly what I say. This is just like I can find you articles online and I randomly run across medical doctors and doctorate psychologists online who don't even know me and say things that are exactly like what I have told you.

What this all adds up to is what should be a self-evident reality. The dozens of medical professionals who have treated me over a period of decades know what they're doing. They know what they're talking about.

I also know what I'm talking about, as a result of studying this on the side for 26 years, and as a result of talking to these same dozens of doctors and other professionals over a very long period of time. 1 hour an month or more with a doctorate level psychologist for 10 or 12 years will put you ahead of the curve, particularly when you're as prone to asking questions as I am.

If Wells Fargo wanted to know any fact relevant to my life and how that fact impacted the person that I turned out to be at age 33 and subsequently, they could have asked me. There is no better source for general questions about my life, because these dozens of professionals have different knowledge bases and skill sets, and they don't all know each other. They also haven't lived my life.

So you have John who has worked a lot with the mentally ill and also people in institutional settings. You have Ray Powers who worked exclusively with children with moderately severe to very severe behavior problems. You have Karen Crane who has a lot of specialized knowledge of autism. I could go on. The only person who has attended 100% of this and extracted the relevant details of each is me. Upon request, I could get doctors to parrot what I say, largely because I'm quite often parroting them when I speak in the first place.

So Wells Fargo could have asked me, but they didn't, because they know it is none of their business. Another reason is because they are scared of the answer. They know that this whole enterprise that they've undertaken is a farce.

I'm sick of writing this. My point is that Wells Fargo's actions are not the actions of someone who has a sincere desire to understand anything about me. They are the actions of someone trying to somehow invent a justification for actions that are not remotely justifiable.
