What helps me is adderall. I've done a bunch of research and it makes perfect sense that adderall would lessen my handicap. I'm working on getting my blood pressure down so that I can get my dose upped. Right now I'm on 30 mg, which is 10 mg less than my dosage at atrium. I need to get back to 40 at least and I really need 60. I think it will be hard to get up to 60. I don't think my provider will go above 40. Just maybe he will sometime way down the road.

My brain has been severely weakened and my cognitive processing resources are impaired. I show every sign of having significant neurological damage. Among the most severely impaired are my working memory, executive function, and attention. I seem to be impaired across the board though. I need to talk to a neurologist. But with those 3 resources being impaired, it makes perfect sense that adderall would help me and reduce my handicap. This is coincidentally (or maybe not coincidentally) exactly what I have said, over and over, since may of 2019, after my symptoms had their first massive uptick.
